In the January 2019, National Governors Association (NGA) report, *Rural Prosperity* through the Arts and Creative Sector: A Rural Action Guide for Governors and States, completed in partnership with the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies; we see that artsbased economic development has been shown to be responsible for more than 600,000 jobs and \$67.5 billion in economic activity in rural communities. "The action guide suggests how rural regions that lose their traditional industries might capitalize on their creative assets to reimagine and realize a new future. The arts and creative industries are well-suited to help advance comprehensive rural development efforts because they complement other industries and can boost the effectiveness of state economic development policies, partnerships, and plans...the action guide offers a five-point policy framework with 27 corresponding action steps, and includes examples of successful arts-based strategies employed in diverse geographic settings.

Involvement in the arts and culture is essential to the resilience of our rural community. From individual cells to large inhabited regions, the creative process expands existing assets, connects the divided, reaches into the margins, and renews what has been damaged.
