# FINAL CURTAIN FOR ALLEGANY ARTS ASSOCIATION

At the last meeting of the Allegany Arts Association on February 1, 2023 the board of directors and remaining active members voted to disband the organization, due to a lack of volunteers.

After the meeting the AAA issued this statement: "By majority vote the existing Allegany County Arts Association Board of Directors has deemed it necessary to dissolve the Allegany County Arts Association due to a lack of active members to take over the duties of the Board and/or to perform the organizational duties required to provide arts services to the residents of Allegany County.

Our Spring Newsletter will be going out as planned and we will be working in partnership with local individuals and organizations to honor our existing commitments to the community.

Please watch for additional announcements regarding the transfer of responsibilities and provisions for local arts services that will take place as a result of this difficult decision."

The AAA was founded in the 1980s and much has changed since a group of dedicated individuals started the organization to support the arts in Allegany County. While dance, music and poetry events were initiated and supported, the AAA's crowning achievement was its decades old free summer arts program for children.

In the 80s there were few ways for artists to show or market their work, today there are many opportunities available venues through local galleries, libraries, and the internet.

Over the last few months the AAA has been slowly shifting responsibilities to the Belfast Organization For Artists.

Other art-focused groups in Wellsville may also be "absorbing" some of the gap left by ending the AAA. The Allegany Artisans are still going strong and produce the annual "Artisans Studio Tour." Art for Rural American is a Wellsville based non-profit that built and manages the Fassett Greenspace in downtown Wellsville.

There are active artists groups, opportunities and galleries in Alfred and Cuba. There are two galleries in Wellsville, The Little Gem gallery is associated with the Wellsville Creative Arts Center where numerous art programs are offered to the public. Studio 34fourteen recently opened near the Wellsville/Scio town line and exhibits a wide-variety of arts including painting, sculpture and ceramics.

### "Shifting Focus" Peter Midgley's Tri-County Exhibit Now - March 18

The art of Peter Midgley will be on exhibit until March 18<sup>th</sup> at the Peg Bothner Art Gallery located at 110 West State St., in Olean


A long-time member of the Wellsville Art Association we first got to know Peter through his pottery and his popular stop on the annual Artist's Tour, but the artist has changed direction.



For the gallery exhibit he wrote, "I first came to art through pottery, which hooked me in 1980 with my first ceramics class. Pottery is seemingly so simple – just mix, earth, water, and fire – yet it is infinitely complex. My fascination with this medium pulled me through a BA degree from the University of Dallas and then an MFA degree from Ohio University. I have been working in clay ever since.

"In 1995, Alfred State College gave me the opportunity to teach, and I discovered an affinity for that. I am still teaching Art and Art History there, and I still (mostly) enjoy it. I started making Ray Guns about eight years ago, for the sheer fun of it. I have always loved Science Fiction, and I have always collected small, cool, retro objects. Suddenly these things connected. The process is refreshing and immediate, without the need to trust a kiln for firing at the end.

"The Encaustic images are very recent, they sprang up suddenly during the recent pandemic. I suppose teaching Art History for all those years finally opened me up to some new possibilities. The hot wax flows and mixes colors in a semi-controlled way, which to me is reminiscent of ceramic glazes during a firing. The major difference is that it happens right in front of you, and it can be controlled in real time. The color interactions are expressive and seem limitless, and the process is both demanding and a genuine pleasure. Regularly switching from pottery to teaching to Steam Punk to expressive color is not always smooth, but this shifting of focus seems to be working, for now."

Cuba Library calls for artist

CUBA - The Cuba circulating library is seeking proposals for the creation and installation of an artisanal artificial tree to be located in the children's area of the Cuba Library at 39 E Main St. Cuba N.Y. Cuba library is in the beginning stages of transforming their children's section into a modern learning/play space that is accessible and inviting to everyone.

A big part of the transformation is bringing natural elements indoors and trying to incorporate those within the space. The centerpiece of this transformation will be an artificial tree. The function of the tree is to create a garden like atmosphere and promote play and exploration by allowing the trunk to be inhabited by children ages 1 to 12. The final product should be aesthetically pleasing, in scale with the surroundings, of durable construction suited to continual use and should require little to no maintenance for at least 10 years.

Dan's business, Jordan Photography and Consulting, is a very popular general portrait-style studio based in Olean.


He recently announced The Olean Public Library will be hosting an exhibit of his work in the Gallery Room throughout March. The exhibit is free to the public.


