Ambitious Art Project in Wellsville

The dream for the Fassett Greenspace in Wellsville was shared by only a few at first. Cassandra Bull (President of Art for Rural America), Andy Glanzman, Andrew Harris and Elaine Hardman and many others planned this perfect use for the former Fassett House lot. Thanks to several local sponsors and two large grants, one from the Garman Family Foundation (for blocks, foundation gravel), and the other from the Ralph Wilson, Jr. Foundation and KaBOOM!, (for six sculptural outdoor musical instruments), nearly \$50,000 has come in to the project. Phase 1 was completed with volunteer community workers and donated labor and equipment from Duggan, LaForge and Lehman, as well as help from Alfred State College Building Trades' students. The drone photo (prior to plantings) shows the project's shape. Designed as a free, relaxing space for the community, it succeeds! Funds for pavers, seating, electric installation, permanent plantings and more are still needed.

Visiting experts shared their knowledge. Elaine Hardman and Eileen Tecza taught wind chimes; Mary Warner, Angelica Ink owner, taught print making and Alice Deres, Art Teacher extraordinaire, taught just about everything in Canaseraga. Along with many other great teachers, Wendy Skinner of the Fountain Arts Center presented classes including paper collage, basic drawing, tiny drama diorama, Plein Air art and drawing in perspective.


